Hearing Loops Come to OLLI

This month, hearing loops will be installed in OLLI's six classrooms on the 5th floor. A hearing loop is a system comprised of a microphone, a transmitter, and copper wire. The microphone picks up the sound, the transmitter converts the sound from analog to electromagnetic, and the copper wire projects the electromagnetic field within the "loop."

Hearing aids which include a "t-coil" receive the signal from the loop. The effect is hearing sound from anywhere within the loop going directly into one's ear, without all of the other sounds in the room being amplified. An audiologist can tell you whether or not your hearing aid has a t-coil, and can activate it, if necessary. Individuals who have no hearing aid or hearing aids without a t-coil can use a "loop receiver," to benefit from the loop.

Below are contributions from two OLLI members on what having hearing loops at OLLI means to them.

Our recently launched 2020 Campaign is OLLI's first major step into securing the financial base that will certainly be needed to support OLLI's future growth. "Growth" here refers to the number, variety, and scope of courses in our academic programs as well as to the steady addition of new members to OLLI's student body. The 2020 Campaign also expands OLLI's capability to address inevitable evolving challenges as we confront them. Those with modern hearing aids will benefit most, while others, including those who don't have such devices, also will experience augmented volume via installed microphones and available headsets. Since most people over 65 experience some hearing loss, we can be sure our current investment will enhance the OLLI experience for many members. OLLI's improvement to American University's facilities may also benefit their own students, especially if the University holds classes in these same rooms when OLLI classes are not scheduled.

Hearing Loss — A Personal View

"Blindness separates people from things; deafness separates people from people."

— Helen Keller

Hearing loss increases inexorably with age. Only about two percent of adults between 45 and 54 have disabling hearing loss, according to the National Institutes of Health. The rate increases to 8.5 percent for those between 55 and 64, to nearly 25 percent for those between 65 and 74, to 50 percent for those 75 and older. Once it starts, it never gets better.

No study has been done on OLLI members, but it is clear that hearing loss is widespread among our membership. Every year, members whose health is otherwise good, drop out of OLLI because they can't follow the class discussion. I've watched many of them go over the dozen years I've been at OLLI, and expect myself to be soon among them.

I lost hearing in my right ear 25 years ago when a simple head cold settled in my ear canal and damaged the auditory nerve. It was difficult at first, but because hearing in my left ear was normal, I adjusted after a few months. I made it a point to tell anyone sitting to my right that I couldn't hear in

Roundhouse Theatre

Tickets, at a special rate for OLLI members, are still available for the Roundhouse Theatre production of that ear, and please don't think I'm ignoring you if I don't respond. A device that I now wear in my right ear looks like a hearing aid, but it really is a simple microphone that picks up sound and transmits it to the hearing aid in my left ear. It works pretty well, but when I hear something I have to look around to see where the sound is coming from. I've lost the ability to tell the direction of sound.

For many years with this situation, I didn't need a hearing aid. Normal hearing in one ear was enough for me to work, have a full life, and--when the time came--to join OLLI. The first class I took was "Thucydides" with Marty Lapin in room 4--the large upstairs room at the Temple Baptist Church. I sat at one end of the table and Marty was at the other. I had no problem hearing him or anyone else.

But gradually, age-related hearing loss began in my good ear. I began making it a point to sit close to the study group leader. This worked so far as the SGL was concerned, but it did not help in hearing comments of others in the class. I gradually gave up on lectures--I couldn't hear well enough to follow a lecture, even sitting in the first row.

Hearing in classes became more and more problematic. In the study groups I lead, the problem is not too bad because I am free to move about the room and get close to whoever is speaking. I'm also freer to ask people to repeat what they said than I am when I am attending a class led by someone else.

Hearing loss is isolating. You can be *in* a group but not *of* a group--you often don't know what's going on. You stop commenting in class because too often when you've done so, the looks on the faces of others make clear that what you've said is irrelevant--the point had already been made or the discussion had moved on. This is what leads many members, whose health is otherwise good, to leave OLLI.

This is coming to an end with the installation of hearing loops in all six of the 5th floor classrooms. For the first time in a long time, along with many other members, I'll be able to sit in an OLLI study group and hear all that is said. It will postpone, if not save, many of us from the isolation that hearing loss inevitably brings.

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

There were two new developments: the larger lecture hall seating 120 and giving early registration preference to members. This helped accommodate all OLLI members who wanted to attend. We will continue to address the need for expanded seating capacity. Upcoming February trips include a play at the Round House Theatre and a self-guided tour of the African American Museum. Board and Staff News

The Nominations and Elections Committee (OLLI Board members Denise Liebowitz and John Thorner, and OLLI members Joan Berman-Chair, Richard Ringell, and Barbara Rollinson) has met and will oversee the nominations and elections process to fill four June 2018 Board director vacancies. The nominees will speak at the April 13th Town Hall meeting prior to the start of elections. The Board adopted a Resolution recognizing the contribution of Besith Pineda, Operations Director, who resigned in January for another job. This month we welcome Jesse Williams, our new Operations Director, with experience and expertise in technology.

Fundraising/Scholarships

We especially thank you for your generous Campaign 2020 contributions. Over \$100,000 has been received to date in cash and pledges towards our 2017-18 goal of \$150,000. This will help replenish and grow our much needed reserves. While we are on budget for the first half of our fiscal year, we have already spent over \$60,000 from our Friends of OLLI Reserve Fund just for hearing loops.

The Lillian Posner Wallace Scholarship Fund has received \$1,000, supplementing an annual \$2,500 contribution (for 5 years) for scholarships in honor of Ray Rasenberger, a past Board chair. The newly formed Scholarship Committee (Sue Boley, Chair; Virginia DeRoze; and Anne Wallace) is administering the scholarship funds.

OLLI-AU Synergy

Expanded hours and space 'on campus' and additional Spring class offerings in the first floor lecture hall reflect our close working relationship with AU. We are also in contact with the AU Alumni/ Development Office and the AU international students' administration. More later as AU-OLLI programs develop. OLLI members are welcome at AU events throughout the year, with listings frequently updated on the OLLI website. You can also scroll to the bottom of this newsletter to see upcoming AU events.

Compass' Progress

There has been steady progress as we benefit from this year's award of \$150,000 in volunteer time from the D.C. nonprofit Compass to assist in our strategic planning. Compass' nine-member team, led by Patrice Feinstein, has been interviewing OLLI Board and committee members, and representatives from AU. The Compass team members are also looking at other OLLIs' organizational structures and programs and providing feedback to us. Compass will provide its preliminary report to the Board and Strategic Planning Committee March 5th.

Hearing Loop Switch hearing aid to T-coil

Hearing loops have been installed in all of OLLI's 5th floor classrooms. Look for the sign above to indicate that hearing loops are present in our classrooms (and elsewhere in the world). Hearing loops allow members with T-coil-enabled hearing aids to hear lectures and class discussions clearly without the aid of additional equipment. Members

who have no T-coil in their hearing aid or who do not use a hearing aid can use a receiver with headset to benefit from the system. The loops will be available to use during the February Shorts. If you are unsure if you have a T-coil or how to use it, contact your audiologist.

Identifying vendors and obtaining competitive bids too design and install the loop systems took more than six months. That time was well spent, though, as we were able to reduce the cost from initial estimates of \$190,000 to \$270,000 down to an actual cost of less than \$60,000.

For individuals to gain the greatest benefit from the loops, it is vital that class members speak in turn and not talk over each other. Please make every effort to do so and to encourage others to do so as well.

A Tribute to Anne Wallace, Retiring Executive Director

The names OLLI and Anne Wallace were synonymous for many years. We appreciate Anne's contribution in bringing us to where we are today. Her cheerfulness and enthusiasm are familiar to our members. They define her outgoing personality. Anne came to OLLI (then known as The Institute for Learning in Retirement) in the fall of 2003. At that time there were about 440 members, a budget of about \$165,000, offerings of 50 classes, and only one other full-time employee. OLLI operated out of Temple Baptist Church and other sites.

During Anne's years as *Executive Director*, OLLI relocated to its modern, new home on the AU campus, and renamed itself to more closely identify with AU. She oversaw an increase in the budget to nearly \$1 million, in the staff to 5 full-time employees, in the number of classes offered to more than 90 each semester, and the number of members to more than 1300 each year. In addition, during her tenure, OLLI at AU received from the Osher Foundation what is now over a \$2 million endowment held by AU, and accumulated nearly \$1 million in its Friends of OLLI Fund. This is a record of achievement for which Anne and all of us are justly proud. We will miss Anne and all that she has brought to OLLI at AU.

At this time, we welcome Tony Long as our new *Executive Director* who will begin June 1. Tony joined OLLI five years ago and most recently serves as *Deputy Director*. In the Middle

Here we are in the middle of the semester. Spring classes have been underway since March and run through early May. Planning for June Minis is at the halfway mark. Proposals are due May 9

and registration starts later in May. The fourth of our seven Spring 2018 lectures takes place today, April 6. Registrations have reached an all-time high as the topics having wide appeal —education, constitutional law, politics, the arts, and literature. And we are at about mid-point in our election cycle for Board members. Six candidates were nominated in late March. Voting is open from April 13 through April 27. Letter from the Chair



Transitioning To A New Era

The end of June marks the end of our second fiscal year in our new "campus." No longer preoccupied by the move, we have settled into our new home.

Now we are evaluating where

OLLI at AU is, and where we should be headed. We are reassessing our internal operations as well as our role as part of the larger AU community.

Internal Operational Changes

Change is underway. In late February, our longtime and devoted Executive Director, Anne Wallace, announced her retirement effective July 1. While Anne will be much missed, we are pleased that succeeding her as Executive Director effective June 1 is our current Deputy Executive Director, Tony Long, supported by Mary Fran Miklitsch in her new role as Director of Planning. Further strong support will continue to be provided by this year's new staff —Jesse Williams as Operations Coordinator, Yolanda Oakcrum as Administrative Coordinator, and through late May, part-time AU senior, Eamon Martin. We've also implemented new policies and procedures. A Personnel Handbook is in place. Members receive preference in attending lectures. The newly formed Scholarship Committee processes tuition assistance requests. This Spring, the Board adopted an Americans with Disabilities Policy, setting the standard for accommodating members with special needs. Recently installed hearing loops in the six classrooms enhance the sound.

Notable Numbers

Several members have inquired about how many members voted in the election or participated in the Survey. Election IDs and passwords were sent to 1,251 members (anyone who participated in a study group or short from Fall 2017 through Spring 2018). Of those, 330 (26%) voted. An invitation to participate in the survey was sent to 1,625 individuals (unique members of the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 academic years). Of those, 531 (33%) took the survey, and 90% of those completed it.

with AU. We are not just AU tenants. We coordinate more closely with the University administration. During the year, AU was able to accommodate some of our additional space requests, as well as adopt a more beneficial financial arrangement with respect to the earnings OLLI receives on the more than \$2 million Osher endowment held by AU for OLLI. We also enhanced our curriculum with classes led by AU Departments of Biology, Chemistry and Physics professors, supplementing our already strong relationship with other AU departments and schools. A new OLLI-AU initiative has linked OLLI members one-on-one with 16 foreign AU graduate students for cultural exchanges and conversations through the AU International Accelerator program.

Looking Ahead: Transitioning to a New Era

OLLI has blossomed from a small staff with a limited budget and a few class offerings 36 years ago to an organization recognized nationally for it strong academic program, with nearly 100 courses each semester and nearly 1,400 members. We benefit from a sound financial basis and strong staff supported by hundreds of volunteers. Now what?

Board Identified Upcoming Challenges

The Board sees key challenges ahead. Our membership, growing approximately 5% a year, is now nearly 1,400. To accommodate the members, and make the best use of our new home, we will continue to explore initiatives such as year-round classes and/or expanded day, evening, and weekend classes. We hope to diversify our enrollees to represent a broader segment of the senior population. At the same time, we need to assure that our current finances, with a nearly \$1 million budget, will be able to fund needed expansion and desired enhancements. Coordinating our strategic plan with AU's will help us meet future space needs. Outreach to AU alumni, many of whom are members of OLLI, will strengthen our mutual ties. We are well on our way to meeting our \$150,000 fundraising goal for the initial phase of our Campaign 2020 this year, assuring sufficient income to meet expenses without unduly depleting the Friends of OLLI Fund. The balance of our

ambitious, three-year \$1.5 million Campaign 2020 lies ahead, as does a need for increased financial transparency to our members.

Strategic Planning Aided by Compass Strategic Alignment Grant

OLLI at AU is tackling these challenges as it plans its future. This year, a Strategic Planning Committee has been developing a proposed five-year strategic plan. The Committee has been aided since August by the nine-member Compass volunteer team provided through our \$150,000 Compass grant of professional staff time. Compass will release its report to the Board and Committee May 22. Results of the March membership survey and focus groups provide further input. The target date for the completion of the plan is this summer. Much has been done. Much is yet to be accomplished.

Letter from the Chair



We learned from the survey and focus groups conducted in the spring that many of our members want more nuts-and-bolts information about how OLLI at AU is run. "Your members want more information about the administration and

organization of OLLI: budget and finance, mission, etc.," our outside facilitator reported. Fair enough, let's start with the money.

In recent years, OLLI at AU has transformed from a modest volunteer organization into a much larger nonprofit with all the attendant requirements: more staff and benefits, technology, financial and legal advice, facilities, etc. The move into the Spring Valley Building came with moving costs, higher rent, and capital investments such as the installation of hearing loops in our 5th floor classrooms. Expenses climbed, and income did not keep pace, requiring us to dip into our reserve funds.

Next week, 14 firsttime ever July Shorts are scheduled, with 134 members registered.

Our lease allows us to use the classrooms and social space from 9:30 AM to 3:30 PM. We are committed to optimizing the use of the space during those hours.

We began the 2017-18 fiscal year with a budget in significant deficit: member tuition was projected to cover only 67 percent of total expenses of \$902,800. Earnings from two investment sources—an American University endowment established by the Bernard Osher Foundation for the benefit of OLLI at AU and the Friends of OLLI Fund, a reserve account owned by OLLI at AU together were expected to cover another 15 percent of operating costs. The substantial funding gap was filled during the course of the year primarily by nearly \$138,000 in generous donations from loyal OLLI members and friends. As a result, we closed our 2017-2018 year with a significantly smaller deficit than anticipated.

The 2018-2019 budget with total expenses of \$798,113 reflects a far more sustainable model. Expanding our academic year to include June Minis and July Shorts has raised income, while reducing outlays for capital investments will lower expenses and decrease our dependence on donations to cover operating expenses. Our goals moving forward are to achieve financial stability that supports an academic program of unrivaled excellence and to maintain a fundraising effort that keeps tuition affordable, funds special initiatives, and grows the Friends of OLLI Fund for future needs.

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

voices were seldom heard at the highest level at
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

A CULTURE OF GIVING

You will soon be receiving in the mail the 2017-2018 OLLI at AU annual report, part of your Board's effort to keep OLLI at AU members and friends better informed. The report gives us an opportunity to

acknowledge our generous donors who gave a whopping \$189,716 and to share an extraordinary statistic: 27% of OLLI members gave a financial gift in the past fiscal year. This remarkably high rate of participation would be the envy of most any university or nonprofit organization. This is particularly true since traditionally, OLLI at AU has done little active fundraising apart from the standard end-of-year appeal. During the past year, we stepped up the fundraising effort, and when we asked, you gave.

In 2017-2018, the generosity of OLLI at AU donors helped close a significant budget gap. And while the budget for the current

fiscal year is in balance and reflects a far more sustainable model going forward, we will continue to look to the generosity of donors to help support our core programs while keeping tuition affordable.

Our new five-year strategic plan, scheduled for Board approval later this month, calls for initiatives on several fronts that will require investment. Initiatives, such as expanding the participation in the OLLI academic program of think tanks, museums, and cultural organizations or acquiring the technology to engage older adult learners and keep pace with new developments, will require funding beyond that available through tuition alone.

There are many reasons and ways to give. In recent months, several funds have been established for targeted needs. The Anne N. Wallace Fund supports staff development and training; the Zuckert, Scoutt & Rasenberger gift provides scholarships for OLLI members in need; and the Alfred E. and Sylvia K. Brown Memorial Fund sponsors social and volunteer appreciation activities.

And, finally, the generosity of OLLI at AU members today ensures that our remarkable lifelong-learning enterprise will thrive and grow in the years ahead and will be there for our successors. By building our reserve fund, we responsibly prepare OLLI at AU for the future and ensure that it will have the space and resources to accommodate a growing membership and provide an unrivaled academic program.

In the coming year we will be asking for your continued commitment to OLLI at AU as we all pursue the shared effort to secure our financial future.

these gatherings once every 18 months for the board chairs and executive directors of its 122 OLLIs around the country. As a first-time participant, I found the chocked-full agenda of presentations, round-table discussions, and sharing of best-practice ideas all energizing and inspiring.

Letter from the Chair



BUILDING THE AU RELATIONSHIP

In early November, OLLI at AU welcomed nearly 400 members and AU students, faculty, and administrators to Kerwin Hall for a lecture by University President Sylvia Burwell followed by a Katzen Center reception. In her remarks, President Burwell reviewed the Past, Present, and Future of the Affordable Care Act, which she shaped as Secretary of the US Department of Health and Human Services. After her talk and on behalf of the OLLI membership, I was honored to present President Burwell with a \$500 gift for the university's Frederick Douglass Distinguished Scholars Program.

The event underscored the strong and growing ties between OLLI and American University and highlighted our lifelong learning program as a valued and contributing part of the university community.

It wasn't always so. Perhaps like yours, my introduction to OLLI took place in the basement of the Temple Baptist Church, an inadequate space available to us for only a few months of the year. I knew that OLLI was somehow connected to American University, but apart from one or two excellent courses taught each semester by generous AU faculty, there was little other evidence of the relationship.

In the fall of 2016 we made the long-anticipated move into the Spring Valley Building establishing all our classes, lectures, offices, and social space under one roof. With great classroom technology and fully modern, functional spaces, we were finally in a facility worthy of the OLLI mission.

As we made ourselves at home, we began to realize the benefits of a strong relationship with the university. Additional AU schools and departments are contributing to our academic program. For the first time this fall, faculty from the AU Departments of Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Math & Statistics, and Physics led a very well received STEM course. AU interns provide valuable help to our office staff, and twenty-two OLLI members are currently partnering with an equal number of AU international students for English language conversation and cross-cultural exchange.

In the months and years ahead, we look forward to strengthening these OLLI-AU ties, as we find additional ways to collaborate around our shared values of academic excellence, service, and lifelong learning.



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

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
