#### **SGR Coordinator:**

SGR Coordinators recruit Study Group Representatives (SGRs) for each class in a given academic session to ensure the classes run smoothly. Some Study Group Leaders select their own SGRs, but for the rest, SGR Coordinators are provided a list of members who have expressed interest in being SGR for each study group, or the attendance list if there are no volunteers. Coordinators then call members before classes start in order to find an SGR for each study group. For the upcoming fall semester, SGR Coordinators will begin making calls after the lottery (September 8th). This role operates on a continuous basis, so if you are unavailable for fall, but are interested in February or spring, please let us know!

## **ACADEMIC PROGRAMMING**

#### **FALL REGISTRATION IS OPEN!**

Registration is now OPEN on the OLLI website for the fall semester (September 26-December 8). Classes are offered online, in-person, and hybrid. In the catalog, each course description lists the format and whether or not the class will be recorded. Courses meet for a varying length of time (see each study group for the number of weeks). The membership fee (\$300 for the semester or \$550 for both fall and spring) allows you to sign up for three courses before the lottery. After the lottery, when you have received your class assignment letter, you can add a **fourth study group** by logging into your account. Make sure to register before the fall lottery on Friday, September 8.

### **IN-PERSON RECORDINGS**

For the first time ever, many in-person fall courses will be recorded and posted on our website. The recordings will be available only to members registered for the fall semester. If an in-person class is being recorded, it is noted in the course description. Each day's recordings are added to the website the following business day. Please note that whether or not a class is recorded is determined by Study Group Leaders' preferences and the office.
