ACADEMIC PROGRAMMING

REGISTRATION IS OPEN!

The February Shorts and spring semester registration is open! OLLI is continuing to offer classes in three formats: **in-person**, **online**, and **hybrid**. The format for each course is listed online and in the print catalog. When registering for a hybrid class, you must select whether you want to attend in-person (hybrid in-person) or online (hybrid online). List both formats if the class is a priority and you're willing to attend either format. You can prioritize up to 12 classes for the lottery. As always, the lottery will then assign you to up to three classes.

FEBRUARY SHORTS

The February Shorts will be held for two weeks: February 5-9 and 12-16. Each Short course runs for 2-5 days during one of the two weeks. You may register for up to three courses in the lottery for the \$100 fee. Your courses do not have to be all within the same week. After the lottery, once you receive your class assignment letter, you can add additional courses—as many open courses as fit in your schedule—by logging into your OLLI account! To take more courses, you can even stack several within the same time slot. For example, if you have a course scheduled for February 5-7 (Mon-Wed) at 11:45 AM, you can add another that meets February 8-9 (Thu-Fri), also at 11:45 AM, instead of having to choose between the two.

Make sure to register before the February Shorts lottery on Wednesday, January 24.

SPRING SEMESTER

The spring semester is March 4–May 10. Courses meet for a varying length of time (see each study group for the number of weeks). The membership fee remains \$300 and hasn't been increased since fall 2017; the fee allows you to sign up for three courses in the lottery. After the lottery, when you have received your class assignment letter, you can add a **fourth study group** by logging into your account.

Make sure to register before the spring lottery on Tuesday, February 20.

The four short plays [and their needs for Male and Female, or Gender Flexible actors] are:

1) **Gutter Day** (Sean Finnell): A widow is stunned by the return of a younger man from her past, moments before her hostile, imperious and sanctimonious oldest brother and others arrive [3M, 2F]

2) **Some Scenes from a Homecoming** (Chuck Jones): A Marine returns from Afghanistan deeply troubled by grief and challenged to find his familiar world now gone [3M, 1GF]

3) **How Can I Be...?** (Jeanne Kent): When a loss of her professional life, and staying at home and caring for her two very young children drives Jeanette out of her mind, she turns to friends and then AI for help [1F, 2M]

4) **The Writers' Group** (Joe Oppenheimer) When a writers' group of homeless meets, misunderstanding of the members' motivations by the volunteer leader leads to conflict [2M, 1F, 3GF]

"Challenges of the Free World in Ukraine, Russia, and the Middle East"

Born in Donetsk, Ukraine when it was part of the USSR, Mr. Sharansky was a leading Soviet dissident and Human Rights activist.

He was imprisoned by the Soviets and sentenced to thirteen years of forced labor. Following a series of hunger strikes while in prison, and an international Human Rights campaign to win his freedom, he was released in 1986 in an international prisoner exchange. After his release he moved to Israel, was involved in the Human Rights campaign that helped facilitate the collapse of the Soviet Union, served in the Israeli Knesset and was twice a Minister in the Government of Israel.

An author of three books, Mr. Sharansky will speak about the "Challenges of the Free World in Ukraine, Russia, and the Middle East."
