Charles Trueheart, *Diplomats at War*April 4 | 1:30 PM

In-Person at OLLI: Room ACharles Trueheart is the author of *Diplomats at*

War: Friendship and Betrayal on the Brink of the Vietnam Conflict (University of Virginia Press), winner of the 2024 Douglas Dillon Award for the best book of the year on American diplomacy. He was director of the American Library in Paris from 2007 to 2017. Most of his earlier career was in journalism, including 15 years at the Washington Post, first covering book publishing and literary topics, then as a correspondent in Canada and France. Before joining the Post, Trueheart was associate director of the Institute of Politics at Harvard University and director of the Kennedy School of Government's Public Affairs Forum.
