# PAINTING SURFACES: WATERCOLORISTS:

Bring a watercolor pad or single sheets of  $9 \times 12$  or  $11 \times 14$  (your choice) for beginning sketches at first class.

Two sheets of  $14 \times 18$  or  $15'' \times 22''$  (or size of your choice, but larger than  $11 \times 14$ ).

#### **ACRYLIC USERS:**

Bring a canvas pad or single sheets of canvas 9 x 12 or 11 x 14 (your choice) for beginning sketches at first class.

For Final Painting:

Acrylic painters can use canvas paper or small canvas of your choice but at least  $14 \times 18$ .
