The Danish Girl (2015)

Awards/recognition:

- Film received five <u>BAFTA Award</u> nominations, including <u>BAFTA Award for Best British Film</u> at the <u>69th British Academy Film Awards</u>.
- Film received Academy Award nominations for <u>Best Production Design</u> and <u>Best Costume Design</u> at the <u>88th Academy Awards</u>.
- Vikander won the <u>Academy Award for Best</u>
 <u>Supporting Actress</u> and Redmayne was nominated for the <u>Academy Award for Best Actor</u>.
- Film grossed \$11.1 million in N. America, \$53.1M in other territories for a worldwide total of \$64.2M, against a budget of \$15Mhare without

The Danish Girl (2)

Director and Producer: Tom Hooper

- * His work was nominated for an Emmy Award for Outstanding Directing for Prime Suspect and John Adams, won award for Elizabeth I.
- Was nominated for the <u>British Academy (BAFTA)</u>
 <u>TV Craft Award</u> for Best Director for <u>Longford</u>. <u>The King's Speech</u> won multiple awards, including Best Director.
- Many wins for Hooper from the <u>Directors Guild of</u> <u>America</u> and the <u>Academy Awards</u> and a Best Director nomination from BAFTA.

The Danish Girl (3)

Synopsis:

The act of posing as a female figure unmasks a popular landscape artist's life-long gender identity as a woman. She then names herself Lili Elbe. This sets off a progression of leaving behind the male identity which she has struggled to maintain all her life.

SETTING: Copenhagen, Paris, Dresden.

The Danish Girl (4)

MAIN CHARACTERS:

- Einar Wegener: successful male Danish landscape artist
- Gerda Wegener: female portrait artist, wife of Einar
- Lili Elbe: Einar, as female
- Hans Axgil: art dealer, childhood friend of Einar
- Henrik Sandahl: gay acquaintance of Einar and Gerda
- Dr. Kurt Warnekros: surgeon, pioneer of sex change operations.

DISCUSSION: what would you say THE DANISH GIRL is about and WHY?

- Disapproval and violence against LGBTQ people?
- Relationship among artists and gender?
- Romantic and platonic relationships?
- Anguish felt by transgender-born people?

The Danish Girl (6)

Questions for discussion:

- Is there anything you do not understand about this film?
- How is Einar's wife Gerda portrayed?
- In your opinion, why does Lili suddenly have a nosebleed?
- How do you interpret the film's ending?
- Why is Art at the core of this story?
- What does this film say about what love is?

The Danish Girl (7)

Questions for discussion:

- In the first clip where Einar goes to the ballet stage to check the scenery, what strikes you?
- Why is it significant that Gerda tells Einar to "Just relax" when she wants him to model the ballet dancer's leg and foot?
- What is the consequence of Gerda's challenge to Einar to "Go as something different."
- How does Henrik Sandahl recognize Einar?

The Danish Girl (8)

Questions for discussion:

- What does Einar do to learn to act like a woman?
- People in this film often ask important questions.
 Hans comes to visit but Lili leaves the room. Einar asks, "Do you think he noticed?" What do you think?
- Gerda asks Einar, "Did I do this to you?" What do you think?
- Einar asks Gerda, "Do you think I'm insane?"
 What do you think?

The Danish Girl (9)

Questions for discussion:

- Does this film take a position on Einar and Gerda's fertility issues?
- Why do you think Einar paints the bog with trees over and over?
- How have America's attitudes changed (or not changed) towards LGBTQ people since the 1990s?
