### **MARTHA CUTTS\***

I retired in July 2016 after 47 years in K-12 education. Most recently I served for eight-plus years as Head of School at Washington Latin Public Charter School. In 1991, I moved to Washington, DC from Connecticut for my position at National Cathedral School as Assistant Head and Director of the Upper School. I have a BA from Mount Holyoke College and an MAT from Yale University. I served as Board Chair and Vice Chair and am currently Secretary. I have been or am now a member of OLLI at AU's Strategic Planning, Development, Lecture, and Diversity Committees. I have also been an OLLI Welcomer for three years. OLLI has been the highlight of my retirement; I look forward to helping the organization continue to grow and thrive.



### **JO ANNE FRIEDENTHAL\***

Treasurer of the OLLI at AU Board of Directors, Chair of the Finance Committee, and a member of the Investment Sub-Committee. I am a retired attorney who specialized in securities, finance, and real estate law and have served as an arbitrator in securities matters. I was a partner in a large San Francisco law firm, and upon moving to DC, was Associate General Counsel for Freddie Mac. I have been a member of OLLI for 12 years and have had the opportunity to take a large variety of fascinating and challenging courses. I have acted as a Study Group Representative for several classes. In 2013, and again in 2016, I served as Chair of the Personnel Committee. I also have been a member of the Nominations Committee, and a committee to review and revise the By-laws.



### **STUART FRISCH**

## National Science Foundation: STEM Survey

The National Science Foundation is conducting a research project to develop measures that reflect older adult engagement in informal STEM learning experiences and potential involvement in STEM (STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) advocacy.

The research team includes 3 University of California - Berkeley entities; OLLI @ Berkeley, the Fung Fellowship, and the Lawrence Hall of Science Educational Research Group.

As part of the measure development, a survey will be conducted to capture older adults responses to questions involving potential interest in STEM and possible STEM advocacy behaviors.

Numerous OLLIs throughtout the country are participating. OLLI @ American University has reviewed this opportunity and agreed to support it by providing the survey to members.

OLLI members do not have to have any personal or professional background in STEM fields to participate.

The survey will be sent the week of April 12th.

# Making Theater Meaningful in DC and Beyond, Raymond Caldwell Friday, April 16 - 1:30-2:30 PM, via Zoom

Raymond Caldwell is the Producing Artistic Director at the Theater Alliance, which he joined in 2017 to curate and produce the company's inaugural Word Becomes Action Festival. He was elevated to Associate Artistic Director at the beginning of 2018 and became the director in 2019. Previously he was a Resident Director and full-time lecturer at Howard University's Theater Department. Caldwell is an accomplished actor, director, and teaching artist. As an actor, he has toured nationally and internationally. He has worked with playwrights including Ntozake Shange, Edward Albee, and Tarell Alvin McCraney. Internationally, he has directed and developed new-work in India, Ukraine, Greece, Germany, and the UK. For five seasons, he has worked for Arena Stage's Community Engagement Division, following a year spent as the company's prestigious Allen Lee Hughes Community Engagement Fellow. He received a BFA in Acting from the University of Florida, and a MFA in Acting from Ohio State University.
