#### **STUDY PURPOSE**

The purpose of the study is to develop new methods for measuring participation, engagement and STEM advocacy among older adults.

#### WHAT AM I BEING ASKED TO DO?

You are being asked to participate in a SURVEY about STEM advocacy. The survey asks about your attitudes and dispositions toward STEM advocacy, your likelihood to engage in certain advocacy behaviors, and your background related to STEM. Participation is completely voluntary.

- **Confidentiality**: The survey is anonymous; no personally identifiable information (e.g., your name) is connected to the survey data either directly or through a coding system.
- **Study Time:** Your participation will take approximately 15 minutes.
- **Study Location:** Your participation is entirely web-based; you will respond to the survey online using the attached link and submit it when finished.
- **Compensation:** You will not be paid for participating in this study.
- **Benefits:** There will be no direct benefit to you for participating in this study; however, it is hoped that the information gained will aid in the development of tools to measure the impact of older adult participation in STEM learning experiences.

William Howell is the Sydney Stein Professor in American Politics at the University of Chicago Harris School of Public Policy, a professor in the Department of Political Science and the College, and the director of the Center for Effective Government. He has written widely on separation-of-powers issues and American political institutions, especially the presidency. He currently is working on research projects on Obama's education initiatives, distributive politics, and the normative foundations of executive power. Howell is the author, most recently, of *Presidents, Populism, and the Crisis of Democracy and Relic: How Our Constitution Undermines Effective Government—and Why We Need a More Powerful Presidency.* Additionally, he is the author or co-author of several other books on American political institutions. Before coming to Harris, Howell taught political science at Harvard University and the University of Wisconsin. He received his PhD from Stanford University. **No registration is required.
