Here are a few important tips to remember for this semester:

ZOOM LINKS: Your class link(s) will be emailed to you each day by 8 am. If you don't receive your class link, please email the office at <u>olli@american.edu</u> – it's important to include the class name and/or class number when you email the office so that we can send you the link right away. For maximum convenience, save the zoom links for your classes, as they are reusable until the end of semester.

CLASS RECORDINGS: Most classes will be recorded and made available to members taking spring classes. The page for class recordings is <u>https://www.olli-</u>

<u>dc.org/2021_spring_recordings_mondays</u> and can be accessed all semester. Class recordings will be posted each day by 5:30 pm. Only members taking spring classes can access this page—you will need your OLLI username and password to log in.

FRIDAY LECTURES: Lectures will be held each Friday at 1:30 pm. You do not need to register for the lectures, and the lecture's link will be included in our Friday newsletter.

FRIDAY NEWSLETTER AND OLLI WEBSITE: The OLLI website and newsletter are the best sources of information for upcoming events and activities at OLLI. The OLLI website is <u>https://www.olli-</u> <u>dc.org</u>. The newsletter will be emailed to you each Friday at 10 am. Again, the newsletter will include the link for each Friday's lecture.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE OFFICE: As the OLLI staff is still working remotely, whenever possible, it is best to email <u>olli@american.edu</u> if you need immediate assistance. It's remarkable that we are only a couple of weeks shy of one year that our program has been completely remote. Closed Captioning

Closed Captioning will be enabled in all Spring classes, so members with hearing loss can view subtitles and/or download a transcription of the class. To take advantage of the captioning, you must turn it on in Zoom.

The "Closed Caption" control should appear in your Zoom control bar. Click on it to select show or hide Subtitles or Transcription. You can control the size of the subtitles. You also can download the transcription of the class. The captioning is not perfect, but it can be very helpful if you have need hearing assistance. Documentation on using Closed Captioning is available on the **Zoom Info page** of our website.
